I. Market Value as of April, 2013


The market value of the Economic and Social Stabilization Fund (ESSF) totaled US\$14,882.3 million as of April of 2013. The market value changed during this month due to: (i) accrued interest of US\$16.3 million, and (ii) capital gains on investments of US\$111.37 million.


Changes in Market Value Since Inception (US\$ million)

II. Return as of April, 2013

Return in April was 0.86% in US dollars and 0.65% in Chilean pesos. Cumulative return during the year totaled -0.77% in US dollars and -2.25% in Chilean pesos. Annualized return since inception was 3.98% in US dollars and 1.80% in Chilean pesos.

Returns for periods of more than one year are compound annualized rates while those for less than a year correspond to the change as seen in the stated period. With a view to meeting high standards of transparency and providing a better assessment of the gains or losses on investments, the Ministry of Finance discloses the fund's return in different time horizons and currencies. With respect to the horizon, it is important to note that, in keeping with the medium- and long-term investment policy, the return assessment should focus on that period, disregarding fluctuations that may occur monthly or quarterly. With regard to returns expressed in different currencies, the return in US dollars allows for an assessment which is more in line with the investment policy given that the fund's resources are wholly invested abroad and in foreign currency. The return in Chilean pesos is also disclosed. This return reflects changes in the peso-dollar exchange rate and, therefore, may experience greater fluctuations. Finally, as with any investment, returns obtained in the past do not guarantee future positive results.
